

I, like many others, enjoy watching birds. At our house, we have several feeders that feed many different kinds of birds with different habits. This summer, we were fascinated with a young, broad-winged hawk that perched in our trees and sometimes on my truck throughout the day, screeching and terrorizing the neighborhood birds.

Now, we watch as the season changes from fall to the fast-approaching winter. Many birds feed to prepare for this change in season. We have seen birds arrive in spring and depart for their destination south after fall.

I recently read an article on bird migration. These birds feed heavily to get ready for their migration. They will look to the sky to continue their migration south. The article goes on to say that when certain birds fly in a v-formation, this reduces their wind resistance, and they use the wind currents to their advantage. If you want to learn the importance of wind currents, you can talk to our brother in Christ, Don Goins, who is an expert in this. This article continues that the lead bird does most of the work. When he tires, he moves back and lets others move up to assume this role. When they are in this v-formation, this allows them to see the rest of the flock, preventing them from crashing into each other. It also lets them know when a bird is in trouble, and they will join that bird. They have strength in unity and safety in numbers.

We are a lot like these birds. We are members of a flock called "Christians." Our lead in our flock is Christ. We gather together with like Christians and feed on God's word for strength and guidance. We teach and learn together. We look after each other and take care of each other's needs and concerns.

Most importantly, we take this journey together, not alone. There is only one way to get there, and that is through Christ. We need each other to get us there. So, when you think of bird migration, think of our journey to heaven. Let Christ be our lead.
